



2024 Horicon Phoenix Scholarship Graduating High School Seniors

Scholarship Guidelines

The Horicon Phoenix Program offers one \$500 annual non-renewable scholarship for **graduating Horicon High School Seniors or Homeschooled Students who are continuing their education at a college/university or at a vocational/technical school.**

This scholarship is offered to support and recognize community engagement in volunteer or leadership activities, and to support the Horicon Phoenix Program mission: **The Horicon Phoenix Program supports our local businesses, schools, civic organizations, and environment with a special emphasis on respect, sustainability, friendship, and the benefits of enjoying life locally.**

Primary Award Criteria

- **Community involvement in volunteer or other civic engagement activities.**

Secondary Award Criteria

- Academic goals, specifically those that are aimed at community engagement and/or serving a community.
- Leadership roles and other involvement.

Eligible Applicants

- Geographic restrictions: the applicants must attend Horicon High School. Homeschooled students must live in the Horicon School District.
- Academic restrictions: applicants must be graduating seniors from Horicon High School or Homeschool equivalent.



Award Restrictions

- This is a non-renewable award and can only be granted to an applicant once.
- This award is for students planning on attending college/university or vocational/technical school.
- The winner will be announced at the beginning of May.
